Maent yn ymuno â chorfforaethau byd-eang mawr fel GSK, RBS, Lloyds Banking Group, Tata Steel ac IBM ar y rhestr o sefydliadau sydd wedi derbyn y gwobrau. Mae'r wobwr yn dilyn proses ymgeisio drylwyr, sy'n cynnwys ymweliad asesu ffurfiol a thystebau gan staff y prosiect.

Mae pob mentor cymheiriaid yn cael ei gofrestru'n awtomatig yn yr

Academi pan fyddant yn dechrau gweithio gyda Cyfle Cymru, ac yn symud ymlaen trwy dair haen y rhaglen wrth iddynt feithrin a chynyddu eu profiad a'u harbenigedd.

Dywedodd cyfarwyddwr y prosiect Lynn Bennoch fod mentoriaid cymheiriaid Cyfle Cymru yn "asedau gwyb" ac yn hanfodol i gyflawni'r prosiect.

"Mae llwyddiant Cyfle Cymru yn seiliedig ar ddoniau a gwaith caled ein mentoriaid cymheiriaid ac rydym mor falch bod ein hymdrechion i gefnogi datblygiad proffesiynol y staff hyn wedi cael eu cydnabod mewn ffordd mor amlwg," meddai.

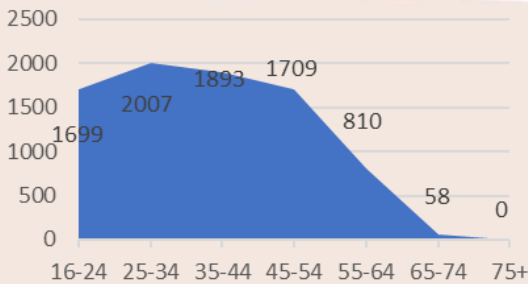

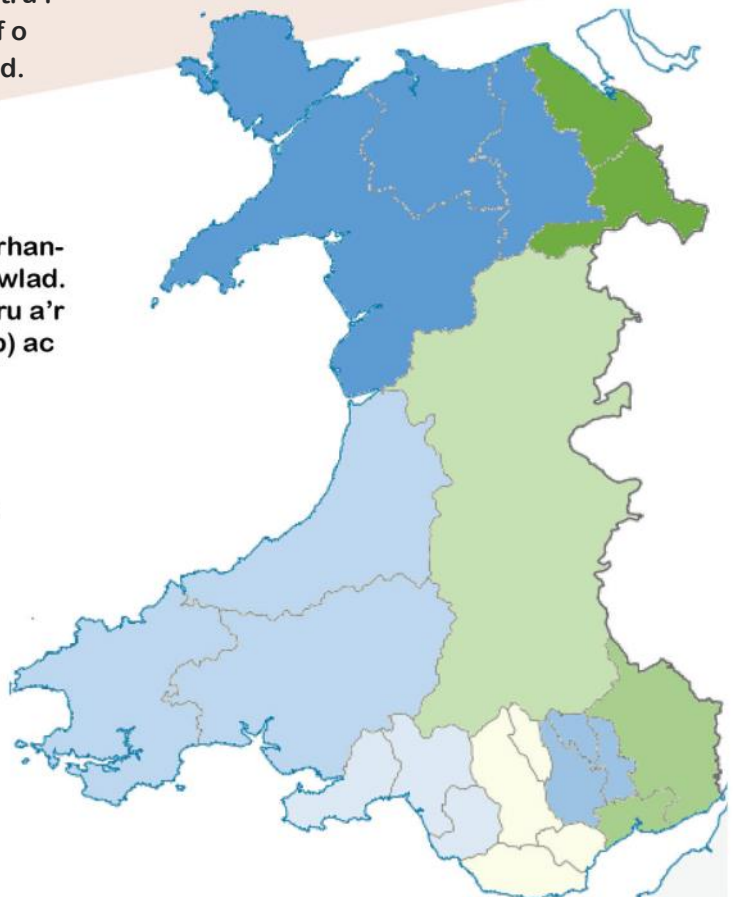

Princess Royal Training Award

CYFLE CYMRU'S successful Peer Mentoring Academy is to be presented with a special award by Princess Anne.

The Academy is one of only 48 training initiatives to receive the Princess Royal Training Award – which recognises outstanding workplace learning – throughout the UK this year.

The scheme offers a practical mix of on-the-job training and formal qualifications, and is available to all mentors working on the EU-funded Cyfle Cymru project throughout Wales. It aims to enhance the professional and personal development opportunities available to mentoring staff, majority of whom have their own lived experience of substance misuse and mental health conditions.

The Academy is one of just a handful of charity and third sector programmes – and one of only half a dozen based in Wales – to receive the coveted award, and joins major global corporates like GSK, RBS, Lloyds Banking Group, Tata Steel and IBM on the list of recipients. The award follows a rigorous application process, which included a formal assessment visit and testimonials from project staff.

All peer mentors are automatically enrolled into the Academy when they start work

with Cyfle Cymru, and progress through the programme's three tiers as they build their experience and expertise.

Project director Lynn Bennoch said Cyfle Cymru's peer mentors were "fantastic assets" and crucial to the delivery of the project.

"Cyfle Cymru's success is based on the talents and hard work of our peer mentors – and we are so pleased that our efforts to support the professional development of these staff have been recognised in such a high-profile way," she said.

Peer mentors who work on the Cyfle Cymru project share their recovery experiences

Ali Beesley Peer Mentor, Gwent



I currently work in Newport as a Peer Mentor for Cyfle Cymru. I work closely with both Hafal teams and the Gwent Drug and Alcohol Service to provide safe spaces to offer employment related support.

I undertook a degree in Criminology, Criminal Justice and Youth Justice and then began volunteering on the Changing Minds project for Mind, which was created as a peer support group for young people between the ages of 14 and 24. This enabled me to undertake peer mentor training and gain great real life experience of mental health issues facing young people.

I originally applied for Hafal as a way to start my desired career and was really surprised that they asked about my own mental health. As a sufferer of major depressive disorder and anxiety, this really has helped me on my way to the final stages of my own recovery.

I love this job because of the way that the support is given, not just for service users but also for staff members. I love the feeling of being included by several different organisations. I also enjoy gaining so much experience in both mental health and substance misuse.

I aim to continue on with this line of work for a while and would like to complete my masters whilst working for Hafal.

Hello All, I would like to introduce myself as the new Employment Specialist covering Powys.

I would like to thank everybody I have met so far for welcoming me so warmly, introducing me to the formalities and procedures and most importantly welcoming me into such a great team. I shall look forward to meeting lots more of you in the coming months. I have also been meeting our external partners to establish links and closer joint working.

Powys is a very rural area and comes with its own unique set of challenges. Although this could be seen as an issue I like to think of it more as an opportunity for Cyfle Cymru to be able to adapt and create new ways of engaging and supporting clients.

Since I started here in March we have started running groups around Powys such as Confidence Building, Mindfulness and Managing Anxiety and have many more workshops planned along the way. I have also been out and about meeting the clients to support them through the process of finding work. It is enthralling to be able to invest time into a mentee to empower them to have that confidence to support themselves in their future lives. We also have an activities day planned in conjunction with Elan Valley for our clients which we are all super excited about!

David



Dave Griffiths received support from WCADA enabling a positive change in his life. After several months of recovery Dave wanted to fill his spare time; Dave was referred to Cyfle Cymru.

Dave received support from Cyfle to complete accredited courses from which he gained confidence and realised his capabilities. He attended Personal Development. He enjoyed this course, as he was “able to open up and talk about recovery experiences without being judged”. Dave volunteered at the allotments helping to plant vegetables, talk about life experiences and “blow the cobwebs” away in the fresh air.

Determined to gain employment, Dave worked closely with Employment Specialists to build confidence at interview, job search and CV skills. After volunteering for 1 ½ years he was offered a Peer Mentor Support position in Port Talbot. This saw Dave supporting Mentors in activities such as Personal Development, Allotments, Craft Group. He enjoyed the “sense of togetherness” working in a team which “gets on so well” and feeling included in achieving the project’s goals, making a positive difference to the individuals supported.

Recently, Dave gained promotion to the position of Peer Mentor where he has experienced “more responsibility and increased working hours”. He enjoys delivering Personal Development where he helps the group gain more awareness of different life experiences. Dave described his current role as an “excellent and rewarding job” giving him “opportunity to make a difference”.

David

My name is David, I have unfortunately had previous problems with mental health and substance misuse and struggled throughout life to achieve any of my goals because of this.

I came to CAIS and Cyfle Cymru low on confidence and self-esteem wanting to turn my life around but unsure how to do it. I began working closely with my peer mentor Neil who also had similar background to me and he gave me the belief that I too could change my life for the better.

I began working on my self-esteem and confidence and Neil helped source a work trial with a construction company called Morton & Jones Ltd. I had an interview with a lovely lady called Sharon and she gave me the chance nobody else ever would and gave me a trial.

I was so happy that somebody had believed in me and I repaid that by working very hard and making sure I gave my all every day. It worked, as I was then given full time employment.

It has been 2 months and I have now been given a promotion to yard supervisor, which I am over the moon about. I have totally turned my life around and I am living proof that it can be done given the right support and opportunities.



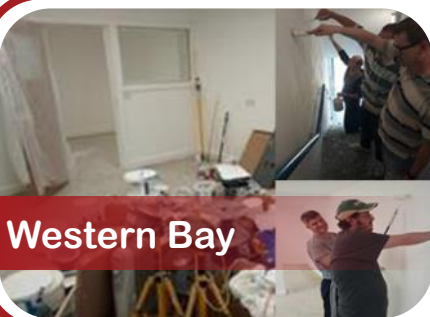
Latest News From Your Area

We have been working alongside North Wales Training providing volunteering opportunities, accredited courses and talks on the dangers of drugs and alcohol on the mind, body and thought processes to young people on training programmes across the area. Volunteers have been working hard to prepare for the grand opening of the community garden at St David's Church in Blaenau Ffestiniog in August; making it from scratch by building planters and seating with guidance from Men's Shed, as well building a barbeque from reclaimed bricks to cook for the community at the opening.



The Gwent team attended the Portstock music festival at Rodney Parade in Newport which was a lovely sunny day. They were in attendance with Gwent Drug and Alcohol Service spreading the word on what support was available around substance misuse, specifically within the music festival scene. All of the events have been a great success and allowed us to talk about working collaboratively in order to best support our clients with their recovery and return to sustainable employment.

All volunteers really enjoy being out in the open air and contributing to making the zoo a great place to be. Being in nature and working around the different animals has a positive effect on everybody's wellbeing. Peer Mentor James said "This project is becoming increasingly popular with volunteers. Everyone works together as a team and are gaining skills and confidence, and it is great to see smiles on everyone's faces".



Eleven of our participants took part painting the headquarters of one of our consortium members, Hafal. Hafal are highly delighted with the high standard of work and the excellent job they did. One participant said that taking part in this activity has boosted his self-esteem and confidence, whilst another described how it will greatly improve his chances of securing future employment as it has allowed him to improve and expand his CV. The participants thoroughly enjoyed this activity and have benefited greatly from it.

Volunteers and Peer Mentors from Cyfle Cymru in Powys are all working hard and coming together to build up the crafts workshop group sessions in Llandrindod Wells. There has been a variety of crafts taking place such as needle work, machine sewing, jewellery making, creating earrings, bracelets, necklaces, phone pouches and much more! The ideas are flowing and everyone is having a good time. Thank you to Deryn for donating a sewing machine to use and a big well done to Liam for all your hard work and input.

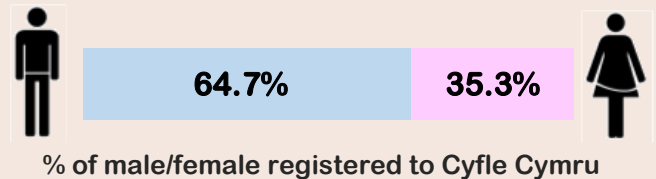
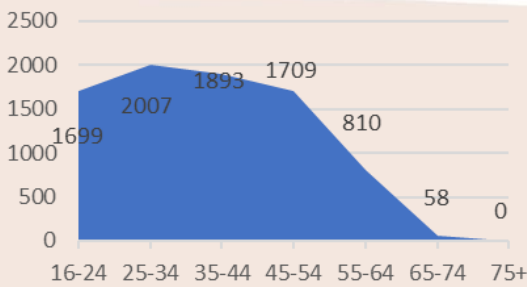
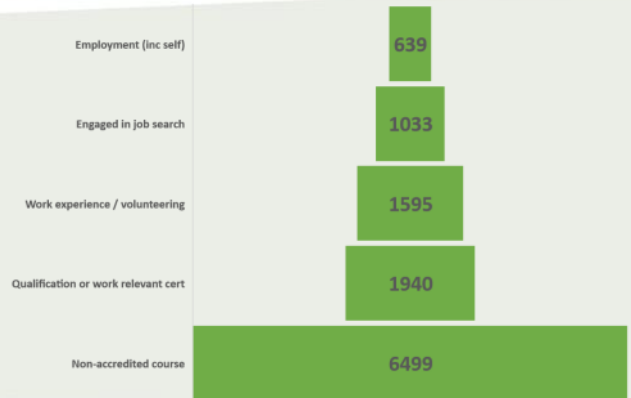


Our latest data bulletin shows how our teams across Wales are helping people overcome challenges to get into or closer to work

FROM AUGUST 2016 TO THE END OF JULY 2019 (i.e. the first twelve quarters), Cyfle Cymru has received a total of 8253 referrals across the five lot areas.

Of these, 8179 have been registered to the service - a registration rate of 99.1%. In total 154,445 hours of support have been given during the project's first twelve quarters.

The average age of people registered to Cyfle Cymru is 40.9. The greatest proportion of registrants is in the 25 to 34 age group.

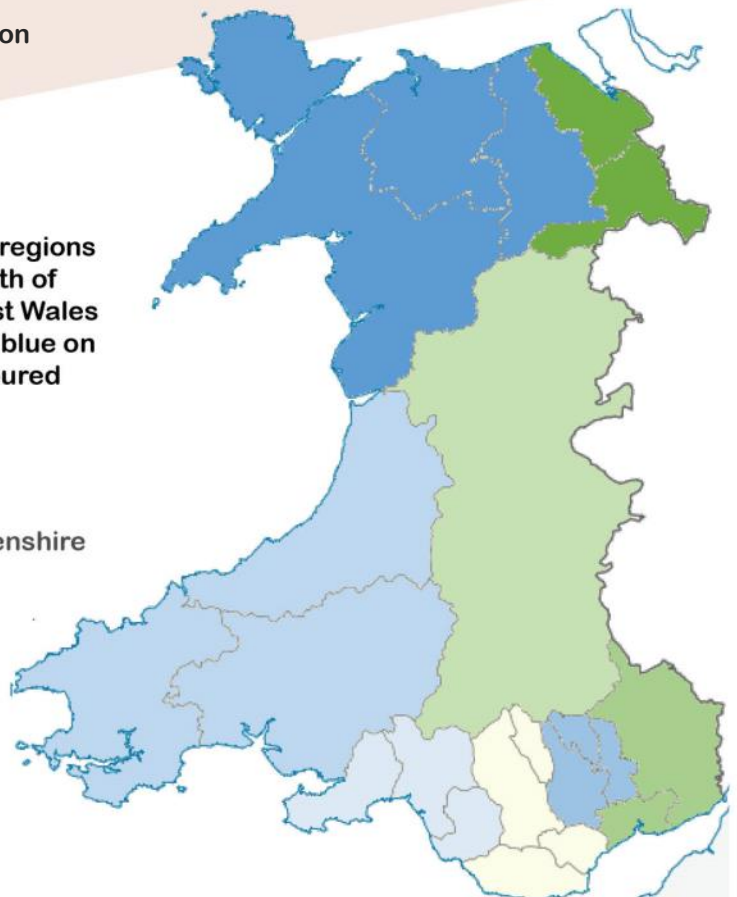

Cyfle Cymru: about the service

CYFLE CYMRU IS a service which helps people with substance misuse issues and/or mental health conditions who are in recovery or are towards the end of their treatment programme into work, education or training.

The project has been funded for an initial two years by the European Social Fund, and is delivered by members of Developing a Caring Wales (DACW) in North Wales, Gwent, Dyfed, Western Bay and Powys.

Cyfle Cymru provides the support needed to find the right job, training opportunity or qualifications.

It offers:

- one-to-one guidance from a peer mentor who can draw on their own experience of substance misuse, recovery and/or mental health conditions;
- specialist employment support, including volunteering opportunities, and help and advice on how to search and apply for jobs.

Who is eligible?

The service can support individuals towards and into work if they:

- are aged 16 to 24 and not in employment, education or training
- are aged 25 or over and long-term unemployed or economically inactive
- live in North Wales, Gwent, Dyfed, Western Bay or Powys
- are in recovery from substance misuse and/or mental health issues

Definition of long-term unemployed

An individual who has been unemployed for more than 12 months and has one or more of the complex barriers below:

- mental health and/or substance misuse issues
- low or no skills
- have care or child care responsibilities
- are from a job less household
- have a work limiting health condition or disability
- from a BME background

Definition of economically inactive

A person who is currently not part of the labour force (in the sense that they are not employed or unemployed) or in education or training, is aged 25 or over, and has one of the complex barriers listed below:

- mental health and/or substance misuse issues
- low or no skills
- care or child care responsibilities
- are from a jobless household
- have a work-limiting health condition or disability
- from a BME background

Please note: individuals must have a substance misuse issue and/or mental health issues to qualify for Cyfle Cymru

Outcomes

The outcomes for the project are as follows:

- completion of a non-accredited course
- gaining a qualification or work-relevant certificate
- entering employment, including self-employment
- engaged in job search upon leaving
- increasing employability through completing work experience placement or volunteering opportunity
- entering further learning
- in employment six months after leaving

Funding for this project is dependent on achieving these outcomes, with specific targets set for each.
